The English Minor in Literature

Declaring Your Minor

In order to declare, go to the English Department Office in University Hall Room 215. The Undergraduate Program Assistant, will provide you with a declaration form for you to complete with the Director of Undergraduate Studies (DUS), Professor Kelly Wisecup. The English Department will keep one copy, while the other copy goes to the Office of Studies at 1922 Sheridan Road. You are now an English Literature Minor!

Introductory Courses (3 Units)

You must complete two of the following Survey courses:

- British Literary Traditions
 - o English 210-1
 - o English 210-2
- American Literary Traditions
 - o English 270-1
 - o English 270-2

You must take either 210-1 **OR** 270-1 and any one of the three remaining courses. In other words, you may take any two of the four courses except the combination 210-2 and 270-2. The two courses can be taken in any order.

You must also complete English 300, a seminar that teaches fundamental skills in reading and interpretation and exposes students to new ways of thinking about literary texts. Students are strongly encouraged to take English 300 early in their career as an English Literature Minor.

Additional Literature Courses (4 Units)

You must complete 4 additional literature courses for the English Literature Minor. Two of these courses must engage primarily with literature written before 1830, and two must engage primarily with literature written after 1830. Courses are marked as pre- and post-1830 both in CAESAR and English Course Listings. One of these courses may be at the 200-level. One of these courses may be in Comp Lit at the 300-level.
